



The King

In Bible terms, a king is: sovereign and reigns.

Sovereign: all power belongs to the king. He determines the rules and what happens. He is sole ruler.

Reign: exercising this power.

A good king uses his power to give his subjects a life of righteousness, peace and joy. (*Rom 14:17*)

A bad king uses his power for his own interests. This type of ruler wants to be worshipped and admired by his subjects.

What does the Bible say about satan?

These verses tell us that satan has power. This evil power is used to blind people, to deceive, to torment and to bind them. He holds people in the grip of fear, sickness, and nightmares. Let us look at who has true power and how you can be freed from satan's evil power. For satan's power is limited.

Although God is Almighty, satan does have some power over this earth. Mankind has been blinded by satan and lost the authority given to him by God by listening to satan. Satan therefore gained power over mankind. But even before this happened God had a plan ready to do something about this.

In these two promises we read that God's Kingdom will always exist. It is much stronger than the kingdom of satan.

This promise speaks of a coming Kingdom of peace. Light will shine in the darkness and the power of satan will be broken. A King is also talked about who shall come to the earth as a child. Justice and righteousness will be the cornerstone of His Kingdom.

The result of Jesus coming is that fear will be removed and we will live in the presence of God. God confirms in a special way that Jesus is the King:

We can see in the OT that the Kingdom of peace is foretold. This Kingdom has a King. God has given His power to the King. Christ, or Messiah (meaning the anointed king) is this King. *Matt 28:18*

Jesus continually listens to God the Father. He does not do His own will but the will of the Father. A prince is prepared for kingship for many years. He has to learn much and also fulfill certain conditions. Only then will He be crowned king. Jesus was also prepared and lived in obedience to God. That is why He was anointed by God with the Holy Spirit. Jesus could destroy the work of satan because He was free from sin and He never sinned. Satan has no authority over Jesus because Jesus lived a holy (pure) life. Jesus showed what it is like to live in complete dependence upon God. We can follow His example and live in complete dependence upon Him. The big question is: "Who is your king and in which kingdom do you want to live?"

EXERCISE:

Do you want Jesus to be King of your life? That means acknowledging that Jesus really exists and is alive today! He wants to be your King. Do you want to follow him? Is that what you want? Think carefully about this question. It means that many things will change in your life.

Prayer:

If you know that you want to choose Jesus as King of your life, then pray the following prayer. If you are not sure then wait and learn more about Jesus as King and who God is. This will be further explained in the next study 'Meeting with the King of the Kingdom'.

"Jesus, thank you for coming into my life. I acknowledge You as King of the Kingdom of God. You love me and want to set me free. I want to recognize your authority. I ask you to be King of my life. Help me to discover what it means to live in Your Kingdom."

Discuss with your mentor what practical steps you can take to apply this lesson to your life.
